Stinging Caterpillars - DON'T TOUCH THESE 3!!!

When you think of caterpillars, you think of worm-like leaf-eaters that are generally harmless to humans. Caterpillars may be hairless, fuzzy like a wooly bear or even tufted with hair – almost inviting you to touch them. But there are "stinging" caterpillars in Florida that should not be touched. To touch any of the different kinds of stinging caterpillars found in Florida can become a painful experience. Beware the "Big 3" – the IO moth caterpillar, the SADDLEBACK caterpillar, and the PUSS caterpillar. Stinging caterpillars have spines tipped with venom known as urticating spines. Many people who touch these caterpillars experience itching or burning; others may have severe reactions that require medical attention.

IO moth caterpillars are brightly colored spiny larva. These large (around two and one-half inches long) caterpillars are pale green with white and red stripes. IO caterpillars may be found feeding on hibiscus, certain palms, and Royal Poinciana, and other plants including wax myrtle.



The PUSS caterpillar is also known as the southern flannel moth. The adult moths are very fluffy and soft in appearance – the Persian cats of the moth world! Up to one inch in length, the gray or brown caterpillars look like walking hair pieces totally covered in what appears to be soft hairs. Scattered amongst the soft hairs are the urticating spines.



Severe pain can be the result of touching this caterpillar when the toxic spines break off in the skin. The toxicity of the sting will tend to increase as the caterpillar grows – it is known as one of the most venomous caterpillars in the U.S. Keep an eye out for them on oaks and elms.

Saddleback caterpillars also give clues that caution is required with bright colors and bristly hairs. This insect larva is brown with a green mid-section outlined in white. A gap in the center of the back gives the entire pattern the appearance of a saddle. The adult moth is small and drab and otherwise unremarkable. Saddlebacks may be found on dozens of plants including



viburnum, Brazilian pepper, a variety of different palms, hollies, hibiscus and Podocarpus.

If you are stung by these caterpillars, the literature suggests that placing common transparent tape over the affected area and striping off the irritating hairs that stick to the tape will help. Applications of ice will help relieve the pain. As mentioned earlier, if the person stung has excruciating pain, asthma, or allergic reactions, obtain medical help immediately.

I am not going to live forever,


but while I am still here,

The LEGAL CHIT- CHAT

Yes... It continues to be a Long Hot Summer- What else is new? Some people insist that Florida has a Summer Season of at Least 10 months...

Our long hot 2024 summer has, at times, morphed into a rainy and muggy season with <u>"feels like"</u> temperatures that are sometimes in the 103+ degree range. This long, hot, rainy, muggy Summer season is sometimes also referred to by Floridians [and by other non-Floridians alike] as the start of THE Hurricane Season.

So, as we move from one of Mother Nature's challenges to another we have to meet those challenges with logic and common sense. First and foremost we must respect the high heat/humidity and make sure that we use sunblock and hydrate. Our health and wellbeing is insured by taking the proper steps to keep our body temperature cooled.

The rain and potential hurricanes present other safety issues. Florida has been known to be the lightning capital of the United States. Thunderstorms and lightning may not only be a problem for driving visibility but also for walking safety. Standing under a tall tree during a lightning storm....Or, walking in a storm that has lightning and thunder, with an umbrella, which is also fondly referred to as a moving lightning rod, might not be the smartest thing to do.

A prudent thing to do is waiting until flooding and standing water subsides. Standing water has a sneaky way of hiding all types of dangers....from snakes, hidden holes or downed power wires....avoidance is the best policy!

What has all these physical safety issues have to do with Estate planning? I am so glad you asked!

Even the best Estate Planning Documents that you may create with the assistance of an Attorney who practices in this area of the law <u>[regarding what happens to your physical assets and properties when you pass away]</u> may be negated or nullified if the <u>physical assets and properties</u> that you seek to distribute at the time of your passing, are destroyed by a casualty loss [a lightning rain storm, a Hurricane, a flood] during your lifetime.

I have touched above on how you can protect your physical wellbeing...but everyone needs to contemplate, be aware of and focus on "things" that might not be so transparent.....for example:

Do you have sufficient Casualty Insurance Coverage for your Home and automobile? [Living in Florida we are all-too aware of the recent, precipitous rising costs of Homeowners Insurance Policies and Automobile Insurance Policies. One way to try to reduce the costs of these Insurance policies is to increase the deductibles and perhaps try to limit the amount of the insurance coverage – assuming that, if you have a mortgage on your Home, taking such course of action [to increase deductibles and/or reduce the extent of such insurance coverage] does not violate the terms of your mortgage.

However, if taking such course of action [for example, increasing your Home Owners Insurance deductibles and/or reducing the extent of such insurance coverage on your home violates the terms of the mortgage that you may have on your home] could cause you to be in default of your mortgage, then and in that event, your lender can "force-place" your Homeowners Insurance coverage at a considerable cost and expense to you, the Homeowner.

Some people, who do <u>not</u> have a mortgage on their home, have even considered [with regard to their planning strategies] taking the ultimate risk of loss by being "self-insured" — or another term for being self-insured is to "go bare"—meaning cancelling their Homeowner's Insurance Policies — which translates to if there is a partial loss or total destruction to their home, the home owner is solely responsible to pay the FULL, TOTAL cost and expense of repairing/remediating any such casualty loss.

Even if your home is <u>not</u> situated in a Flood Zone, you should ask yourself if you should you consider obtaining Flood Insurance that protects you in the event of rising waters that flood and potentially destroy your home.

Also, are your important papers safe from the elements, as well? You should <u>have</u>, at a minimum, DUPLICATE copies of your important papers in a different location than your home or possibly with a trusted member of your family or with a friend.

You should always keep your ORIGINAL Documents/ important papers in a "safe" place. Some people keep these originals in a Bank Safe Deposit Box/Vault. You should always let a trusted relative or friend know where the papers are located. Other people may want to keep their important/original papers close at-hand...maybe in a home safe or file cabinet. Unless those "safe places" in your home are waterproof/water-tight you need to place those documents in some sort of waterproof protective envelope.

As we transport through our mature/older years it is important to take stock of and make sure we are the best that we can be! That notion takes into account not only our physical, but also our mental, emotional and financial wellbeing. It is never too early to audit and review our personal planning situations and maybe tweak and/or modify what we need to do to make our personal **situation**

better!
