The LEGAL CHIT- CHAT

BEWARE OF SIGNING A CONTRACT WHEN YOU HAVE LITTLE OR

NO KNOWLEDGE ABOUT ITS CONTENT.

The one area of the law that touches or affects almost everyone is Contract Law. Whether you purchase/lease a car, obtain a new credit card, open a bank or security account, enter into a Real Estate Listing Agreement, enter into Agreement to Buy or Lease a Home, or enter into ANY type of document that defines and describes the rights and obligations of the parties to the arrangement, you are, in effect, once you and the other party signs it entering into a legally binding contract.

Your failure to read the document that you are about to sign [including an abundance of "small print"] does not excuse you from complying with your obligations under the terms and provisions of the document that you have signed. If you go into a hospital for a procedure and you are asked to sign consent forms, once you sign those forms, you are entering into a "form of a Contract" that you have agreed-to by signing those forms.

I am sure you have heard the statement that Contracts are "etched in stone" and the terms and conditions cannot usually be modified, deleted, or changed in any manner after you have executed the Contract. That is basically a true statement.

HOWEVER, an exception to that rule is that BOTH parties to a Contract can MUTUALLY agree to modify and amend ANY term or provision of the Contract — if the Contact and any mutually agreed-to modification is not to perform an illegal activity.

I remember my mother going into a hospital for a medical/surgical procedure at 92 years of age. She was to have administered an epidural, however, in her consent form documents was a provision that authorized the surgeon/anesthesiologist to administer general anesthesia, which for someone my mom's age might not be a good thing.

I was told it was a "standard form" to sign it. I was my mother's advocate. I spoke with the Surgeon/ anesthesiologist and the surgery went forward WITHOUT the authorization to potentially administer the alternate form of general anesthesia.

How about you trade-in you cell phone for a free [or reduced price] new cell phone and sign the Mobile Company's numerous pages of <u>standard forms</u> without reading the terms and provisions? It is surprising how many "extras" you may have agreed to. You need to be your own advocate.

If you feel you are unable to comprehend completely what you are agreeing to, and if the situation warrants, it may be prudent to have an independent professional/expert who has experience in reviewing the particular type of Contact that you are about to sign and enter into, review on your

behalf, the Contract BEFORE you sign it rather than just going forward with a "full head of steam" and signing a document/Contract that you have very little knowledge about its contents and what you are binding yourself to do once the Contract is signed.
